Zoo Atlanta recently announced its receipt of a \$20 million grant from the Robert W. Woodruff Foundation in support for an expansion of Atlanta's oldest cultural destination. The \$38 million capital campaign, entitled "A Grand New View for Zoo Atlanta: Elephants, Events & Expansion," will facilitate the transformation of the 1921 Cyclorama building and the property immediately surrounding the historic structure. Both Mayor Reed and Arthur M. Blank, chairman of The Arthur M. Blank Family Foundation and owner of the Atlanta Falcons, have agreed to serve as Honorary Chairs of the campaign.

On October 20, 2014, the [Center for Civic Innovation](http://www.civicatlanta.org) (CCI) launched a challenge to find innovative ways to bring healthy, affordable, and clean food to Atlanta's neighborhoods. The goal is to find projects and ideas at various stages of the business process that will be accepted into a three to five month accelerator process (called a "civic lab") with free work space, mentors, resources, etc. Additionally, at the end of the civic lab, CCI helps link their projects to funders and service contracts.
