

Pathways STEAM		
Girls Who Code	\$300,000 over 3 years	To grow local Atlanta programming to reach over 1400 Black and Latina girls to be competitive in the tech talent pipeline, with over 400 girls participating in a summer career program. In addition, to invest in small STEAM programs who are working with girls.
National Math and Science Initiative	\$215,000 over 2 years	To increase the number of Washington HS, Clayton and DeKalb County students taking and earning qualifying scores in Advance Placement courses and exams in math, science, and English, as well to bring sustainable changes to school and district practices.
MK Level Playing Field Institute	\$300,000 over 3 years	To prepare up to 150 underrepresented high school students of color in the greater Atlanta area to pursue and persist in STEM in over x years college and careers through an intensive three-year summer residential program at Morehouse College.
Georgia Tech CEISMC	\$250,000 over 2 years	To support 600 Westside students in year-round STEM programming and enrichment as well as provide professional development for 80 Washington Cluster teachers and administrators.
STEAMsport	\$100,000 over 2 years	To partner with neighborhood groups to expand existing year-round academic programming for 100 Vine City, Castleberry Hill, and Ashview Heights kids, with a focus on STEAM education and enrichment.
True North Media	\$75,000 over 1 year	To increase the number of students in Fulton, Clayton, and DeKalb counties participating in local science fairs.
Atlanta Science Festival	\$180,000 over 2 years	To cultivate fifty middle and high school student STEM leaders in Metro Atlanta through the Chief Science Officer program, enhancing their leadership, communication, and advocacy skills to meet the growing demand for these skills in STEM careers.

Pathways Education Reform

The Black Teacher Collaborative	\$100,000 over two years	To support a three-year teacher development program for 80 APS teachers that provides differentiated, racial identity-focused and culturally affirming training and development for Black teachers serving predominantly Black student populations.
Next Generation Men and Women	\$100,000 over two years	To prepare over 200 Metro Atlanta high schools students for college and career through an intensive, four-year mentorship program.
Community Foundation of Greater Atlanta - redefinED atlanta	Additional \$250,000 for total of \$2.05M over three years	To expand grassroots and grass-tops community organizations, educational advocacy, and stakeholder engagement efforts throughout the city to expand and support high-quality school leadership pipelines for Atlanta.
